Reports & Updates:

- The objective of the meeting was to update the members on any changes to the rules development;
- The proposed changes to AQMD Rule 1171 Solvent Cleaning Operations- were reviewed and discussed;
- The most relevant part to the rule change is the prohibiting of PCBTF and TBAC use as solvent cleaners;
- The definitions of Rule 1171 were reviewed;
- There was a discussion on how the proposed prohibitions would affect SPRI Members;
- The timeline of the rule development process was reviewed;
- There was a discussion on how the AQMD Governing Board sets the pace of the rule development;

*SPRI complies with antitrust laws and requires participants in its programs to comply with antitrust laws. Discussions which could affect competitive pricing decisions or other competitive factors are forbidden. There may be no discussions of pricing policies or future prices, production capacity, profit margins or other factors that may tend to influence prices. In discussing technical issues, care should be taken to avoid discussing potential or planned competitive activities. Members and participants should be familiar with the SPRI Antitrust Policy and act in conformity with it.

- The draft rule is expected to come out in May 2025, according to the Governing Board's 2025 Master Schedule;
- A survey was developed to have Industry Insights (formerly ARI) administer a poll of the SPRI Members on PCBTF and TBAC uses;
- Industry Insights will charge SPRI \$5,000 to perform the survey, collate the responses, and issue the compiled data to SPRI; and
- The Task Force will present the findings to the Technical Committee for approval of the funds for the Survey.
